News from the Indigenous Education Department

With all the snow and the long January nights, the Indigenous students thought it would be a good idea to brighten up the hallways of NES. We have done this by creating Metis dot art flowers and mushrooms. Metis dot art was created using principles of First-Nations culture that is blended with European and Australian art techniques. The technique is called pointillism. Metis people use pointillism because it gives a similar aesthetic to traditional Metis beading. Often Metis dot art is used to create flowers and other plants found in nature. When looking a Metis dot art, look closely to see if you can find a dot that does not belong. This represents that nothing or nobody is perfect. That we all have certain flaws, yet when looking at the bigger picture we all have beauty.

Want to try Metis dot art at home? All you need is paint, paper, a pencil and Q-tips!
